Threat of life or freedom under 243(h) of the INA. A non-citizen who is lawfully present in the US as a result of the Attorney General withholding deportation under 243(h) of the INA [thr to life or freedom].	eat
Amnesty under 245 of the INA. A non-citizen lawfully admitted for temporary or permanent residence under 245(a) of the INA.
