





# HOUSING AUTHORITY

OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA





Most of us recognize that one of the greatest challenges for our island community is the lack of affordable workforce housing. In keeping with tradition, going all the way back to 1938, the Housing Authority continues to lead the way in developing new opportunities to help resolve the housing crisis.

Currently under construction is the Garden View Apartments complex on College Road. Situated on the old Easter Seals and SCPA sites, the completed project will feature one hundred three (103) 1-bedroom/1-bathroom apartments. Rents will vary from extremely low-income (25%) to low-income (80%) of Area Median Income (AMI). This beautiful complex should be ready for occupancy mid 2023. A waiting list will become available when we get closer to completion.

This project would not have been possible without the strong leadership of the Housing Authority Board and our strategic partners: the City of Key West, the Monroe County Land Authority, and the Florida Housing Finance Corporation.

#### HISTORICAL REMEMBERANCE

Robert Gabriel represented Monroe County in the Florida House of Representatives in 1879 and served four years on the Key West City Commission (1905-1909). In addition, he was employed as a United States customs inspector. Mr. Gabriel resided in the Bahama Village Neighborhood and lived at 1125 Thomas Street until his death on October 18, 1922. The Robert Gabriel Apartments were named for him by the Key West Housing Authority in 1958.

# SPRING CLEANING

The occasional chilly days are gone, flowers are in full bloom, and the locals are back to swimming at the beach. Its springtime in Key West!

One of our favorite ways to say goodbye to winter and to welcome in the new season is to take part in the tradition of **Spring Cleaning**. It can sometimes feel like a challenging mission, but it doesn't need to be. There is no rule that it needs to be done all at once!

Here are some tips to get you started:

#### Get help.

Spring cleaning benefits everybody in the household, so everybody that can participate should. Even the littlest members of our families can join in with age-appropriate tasks. Make it fun! Put on some music to dance to while vacuuming. Add a reward as an

Pail with cleaning items including gloves, spray bottle, incentive to motivate family. Cleaning can also be great exercise. towels, dust pan, and scrub brush.

#### Eliminate clutter.

Less stuff owned equals less stuff to clean. One of the first things to get your spring cleaning mission well on its way is to look in every room and find items that should be thrown away, recycled, or donated. Don't forget to check drawers, cabinets, and closets. This will free up space for items to be put away and out of sight! Also throw out any expired or otherwise compromised food.

#### Start at the top.

# **LOOKING BACK**

Reflecting on 2021, it was certainly a year for the record books. The Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic was one of the top news stories, but fortunately most of us came through it okay. We said goodbye to longtime Executive Director Manuel Castillo and welcomed our own Randy Sterling to that position. Even with the pandemic raging, the Housing Authority was able to complete nearly 100 improvements to its properties and to the administration of the programs. Below are some of the highlights:

- ♦ Introduced a new logo and launched a brand-new ADA compliant website: www.kwha.org.
- ♦ Hired an arborist for a major tree trimming and removal of invasive species at KPA, KPB, Lang Milian, and Fort Village.
- ♦ Painted the lobby and common areas of the Senior Citizens Plaza. Repainted the exteriors of the Lang Milian and George Allen Apartments.
- ♦ Modified and expanded pest control contracts for all five public housing developments and at the Jack T. Murray Senior Citizen Complex.
- ♦ Installed Dumpster enclosures at George Allen and Lang Milian Apartments.
- ♦ Started construction of the new 103-unit affordable housing property on College Road, known as the Garden View Apartments.
- ♦ Secured funding from both the City of Key West and Monroe County to continue operations at Poinciana Gardens, assuring continued assisted living and supported housing for our seniors.
- Rebuilt the elevator shaft and replaced a portion of the roof at SCP.
- ♦ Secured an additional 28 Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8).

Although 2021 was busy, we have a lot in store for 2022. A few major projects in the works right now include brand new kitchens for 49 units of the Robert Gabriel Apartments, new perimeter fencing for the sides and front of the George Allen Apartments, and new playground equipment for the Robert Gabriel Apartments—Site C and the Lang Milian Apartments (open to all public housing residents).

# RESIDENT ACTIVITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES WITH WR. GARY

Mr. Gary coordinates the **Housing Authority's free afterschool children's program** on Mondays and Wednesdays. Our after-school classroom is located at our Lang Milian Apartment complex, 301 White Street, unit 13-G. Enrolled children arrive after school to enjoy a safe, structured and fun program. Mr. Gary provides homework assistance, educational guidance, structured play activities with a focus on good-sportsmanship, field trips and healthy snack program. Children are encouraged to make positive choices, individually, and as a group. Space is limited and enrollment is required.

Our children's program operates all year long, during school breaks, and summer. Through the generosity of our community partners, children may be eligible to attend **free week-long summer camp adventures through scholarships** sponsored by the Key West Art and Historical Society's *ARTCAMP!* and Reef Relief's *Coral Camp*.

Housing Authority families who participate in the *SNAP program* are invited to participate in the *Museums for All program* at the Key West Art and Historical Society. Admission is free at all KWAHS museums; the Custom House, Key West Lighthouse, Fort East Martello Tower, and the Tennessee Williams Museum. High school seniors, who seek higher education after high school, may be eligible to apply for a **Housing Authority Class**Night Scholarship award. This year, the Housing Authority is also very pleased to offer a NEW collaborative scholarship award with the Gulf Atlantic Bank.
