KEY WEST HOUSING AUTHORITY AWARDED \$2,500,000 GRANT

The Key West Housing Authority was recently awarded a major grant of \$2,500,000 to significantly upgrade electrical distribution and to replace both a transformer and the backup generator at the Henry V. Haskins Senior Citizens Plaza. The federal grant would not have been possible without the tremendous effort of Congressman Carlos Gimenez and his dedicated staff and the support received from the Housing Authority Board of Directors, the Key West City Commission, the Board of County Commissioners, and Keys Energy.

KWHA Executive Director Mr. Sterling stated, "While the current transformer and existing generator are in place and functioning properly, they are dated and close to the equipment's life expectancy. We thought it best to be proactive and apply for the Federally funded Economic Development Initiative Grant so that we do not encounter disruption in service to our residents in the face of an emergency that could arise with older equipment." The generator is in place so that in the event of a sustained power outage, the property's many senior residents would be able to use the elevator and have power for respirators, oxygen generators, and for the refrigeration of food and vital medicines.

The five-story Senior Citizen Plaza comprises 199 units with approximately 230 residents.

The ribbon cutting ceremony for the Senior Citizen's Plaza (SCP), located at

1400 Kennedy Drive, was announced in the November 1, 1972 issue of the Key West Citizen Newspaper.

A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hurricane season started on June 1, and by June 3, we were all experiencing several days of tropical storm conditions. I certainly pray that wasn't any indication of how this year will be! However, like the old stoic proverb says, hope for the best, but prepare for the worst.

Updated KWHA hurricane preparation packets went out to all residents during the first week of June. If you have not received your packet, please contact your housing manager. You should have also received one during your move-in orientation. These packets provide vital information, including how to operate shutters (for those residents residing in units with shutters), how to register for the special needs registry, and where to evacuate

locally in the case of a Category 1 or 2 storm. Remember, Monroe County will be closed in the case of a Category 3, 4, or 5 hurricane, and evacuation is mandatory.

Preparation and planning is so important, whether you opt to shelter in place or to evacuate. The Florida Division of Emergency Management provides a great tool on their website to help you create a custom plan that meets you and your family's needs. I highly recommend that you check it out:

KWHA Awards \$3400 in Scholarships to Graduating High School Seniors

At the KWHA Board of Commissioners' June meeting, six housing resident high school seniors were awarded scholarships. The funds will assist the graduates with their plans for college.

Four of the scholarships were sponsored by the KWHA and two were sponsored by Gulf Atlantic Bank. The total funding this year was nearly triple of what was offered in years past.

In addition, Gulf Atlantic Bank has pledged to double their sponsorship for next year's graduating Class of 2023.

Back-To-School Sales Tax Holiday

Monday, July 25, 2022 through Sunday, August 7, 2022

During the sales tax holiday period, tax is not due on the retail sale of:

- \bullet Clothing, footwear, and certain accessories with a sales price of \$100 or less per item
- Certain school supplies with a sales price of \$50 or less per item,
- · Learning aids and jigsaw puzzles with a sales price of \$30 or less
- Personal computers and certain computer-related accessories with a sales price of \$1,500 or less, when purchased for noncommercial home or personal use

LOOKING BACK—MOVING FORWARD

Spring was a very busy season for the Housing Authority! Below are just a few of the highlights:

- A KHWA contractor began installation of new kitchen cabinets and countertops for all of the units of the Robert Gabriel Apartments that had outdated and worn kitchens.
- ♦ The KWHA contracted with an assisted living facility consultant to provide consulting, marketing, and management services for the Frank P. Toppino Poinciana Gardens Senior Living Complex.
- ♦ Executive Director Sterling secured approval from the KWHA Board of Commissioners to undertake the redevelopment of the Lang Milian Apartments through HUD's Rental Assistance Demonstration or Section 18 Disposition Programs.
- ♦ The Board awarded a mid-year emergency 3-percent cost of living adjustment for all staff to partially offset soaring inflation (the fastest annualized acceleration in the price of consumer goods since February 1982!).
- ♦ Occupancy & Admissions (O&A) staff led a Section 8 eligibility determination meeting, helping a total of 19 invited families with their applications.
- ♦ Executive Director Randy Sterling reimplemented the "Employee of the Quarter" recognition. Property Manager Ms. Kenya Strachan was selected and she was presented with a plaque and a check. Congratulations, Kenya!!!
- ♦ Major concrete spalling concrete repair was started at the Washington Street Apartments. Other small improvements to the property include new mailboxes, sidewalk repair, and new address numbering hardware.

Although Spring was busy, we have **A LOT** more in store. A few major projects in the works right now include the installation of brand new playground equipment for the Robert Gabriel Apartments—Site C and the Lang Milian Apartments (open to all public housing residents), concrete spalling repair and new balconies for a portion of the Senior Citizen Plaza, the completion of the George Allen laundry room, and perimeter fencing for the Robert Gabriel Site A property.
