The two large planters located on the west end of the courtyard at the Senior Citizen Plaza recently received a major makeover. The Trophia Butterfly Foundation and George Fernandez generously provided materials and staff to transform the previously overgrown areas into attractive spots where residents can relax and enjoy nature. Work included pressure washing,

plantings of liriope, firebush, ixora, and ferns, and the installation of two stunning butterfly focal points, one for each planter. The Housing Authority and its residents are grateful for the generosity and look forward to enjoying the revamped outdoor space for years to come!

### HISTORICAL REMEMBRANCE

Douglass Square Apartments—800 Emma Street

The Douglass Square Apartments, located at 800 Emma Street, were completed in 1991. The Key West Housing Authority owns the land and the apartments are owned and operated by a private company. The Developer agreed through a 1990 Land Use Restriction Agreement to provide at least 34% of the units for rental to very low-income persons or families for a minimum period of 25 years.



What is your favorite restaurant? *Currently, I really like El Habanero!* 


Do you prefer cats or dogs? I am currently between pets right now, but I love both. When I was younger, I wanted to become a veterinarian.

Ends June 30, 2023

The two tax holidays eliminate tax on the retail sale of children's diapers, including single-use diapers, reusable diapers, & reusable diaper inserts and on the retail sale of baby & toddler clothing, apparel, & shoes, primarily intended for children age 5 or younger.

Winter was an exciting season at the Housing Authority! Below are just a few of the highlights:

- ♦ Major tree trimmings happened at the George Allen Apartments, Senior Citizen Plaza, Robert Gabriel Site A & Site C, Jack T. Murray, & Roosevelt Gardens.
- ♦ A substantial amount of progress was made at the new Garden View Apartments on College Road and staff expects to start leasing apartments by summer.
- ♦ The buildings at Robert Gabriel Sites A, B, and C were pressure washed and painted with colors approved by the Historic Architectural Review Committee.
- ♦ New property signage was installed at Robert Gabriel Sites A, B, and C.
- ♦ New landscaping was installed at Robert Gabriel Site C, at the corner of Whitehead and Petronia.
